THE CONCERN...THE CALL TO SUPPORT PASTORS' WIVES BY MILTON CARTER*

In recent years, there has been a growing discussion related to the needs of pastors' wives and doing something to meet those needs. This discussion has become an intense, focused call to provide "support groups" for pastor's wives. Having spent many years working with an initiative that established more than 100 pastoral covenant and mentoring groups for pastors, the number one concern voiced to me by participating pastors has been, "When are we going to start covenant groups for our wives?"

THE CHALLENGES

Sarah Jane Wessels in her article, *Care for the Pastor's Wives, Too!*, highlights the need for care/support groups for pastors' wives. Wessels describes the pain and hurt pastors' wives often experience in this way: "The pastor's wife is the secondary, innocent, victim of the stress that so badly affects her husband." She summarizes the concern for the 21st century pastor's wife by sharing how role expectations often negatively affect them with emotions such as loneliness, dissatisfaction, frustration, anxiety, guilt, and anger. One recommendation Wessels gives for addressing these stressors is "Pastors wives should form a care-for-one-another (pastor pastorum) system of their own." Another voice raising our consciousness for the needs of pastors' wives is former pastor Joe McKeever. In recent blogs, he describes the pastor's wife as the most vulnerable person in the church building. Note his pointed observations of a pastor's wife: "... she is the single most likely person to become the victim of malicious gossip, sneaky innuendo, impossible expectations, and pastoral frustrations. The pastor's wife can be hurt in a hundred ways — through attacks on her husband, her children, herself. Her pain is magnified by one great reality: She cannot fight back."
